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VICE CHANCELLOR'S MESSAGE

In the last 35 years, there are many ways in which an education has remained constant unchanging. The University has prepared students for leadership and excellence in their chosen professions through a rigorous academic programme that emphasises a commitment to getting things done with scarce resources and time. This pursuit of excellence is grounded in the ethical commitment to economic and social transformation that realises constitutional values. We're confident that the 31st cohort of graduates will galvanise their talents in the legal and other professions, social service and through startups in legal technology and social enterprises. We're proud of the diversity of career choices our graduates make, and look forward to discovering with them, the breadth and depth of their potential to transform our world in new and yet to be imagined ways.



In 2021, the governing bodies of the University carefully deliberated and then adopted the NLSIU Inclusion and Expansion Plan 2021–25. This 5 year plan set out an ambitious agenda for the University; including a 340% increase in students from 500 to 2200; a 300% increase in faculty from 30 to 120 and a corresponding increase in University infrastructure, administrative capacity and technology to accommodate this meteoric growth.

I am glad to report today that, despite the considerable odds being stacked against us, we have implemented and delivered this Plan fully to this point. We began Academic Year 2023–24 with 1078 on-campus students of whom nearly 450 joined the University this Academic Year. As of July 2023, we have 77 faculty of whom 66 have joined the University in the last 3 Academic Years. While expanding the overall numbers, the University today has the most socially inclusive student and faculty body in its history. It is no surprise that admission to the National Law School is a coveted opportunity sought by all. We're committed to being the first choice of every aspiring young student from every community irrespective of their social and economic background. Our ability to remain a selective, yet inclusive, University will depend on our continued ability to expand and grow.

To accommodate this remarkable expansion, the University has invested in the expansion of physical and digital infrastructure at unprecedented rates. Earlier this morning we inaugurated a comprehensively redeveloped library which expands capacity from a little over 250 to 600 and reimagines the library to be the centre of student social life and collaborative learning practices. This redevelopment project was completed in six months and was generously supported by an external donor and the grants from the Government of Karnataka. We've also made considerable progress on an expansive digitization project to make all our library books available digitally to specially abled students to work towards universal accessibility of all library resources.

This University was envisaged as a fully residential University and hence, in the last year, we have increased the number of hostel beds available from around 780 to over 1000 while simultaneously improving and upgrading the room furniture, toilets and other amenities in each of the Hostels. For the first time in the University's history every hostel room has contemporary wooden furniture and bedding, and the interiors of every room is cleaned every week to ensure a healthy and clean living environment. These hostel facilities compare favourably with international University standards and we hope to constantly raise the bar with every passing year. The University remains committed to a residential academic community, but we will need the support of the Government of Karnataka and other philanthropic institutions to secure additional land and resources to build residential facilities for our fast expanding student and faculty body.

VICE CHANCELLOR'S MESSAGE

This rapid expansion of the University has been implemented in a manner that ensures that we maintain and enhance our academic leadership. Every public and private ranking agency that published a ranking of Indian law schools this year places NLSIU as the No.1 Law School in India. These rankings recognize the University's ability to reinvigorate its curriculum and pedagogy consistently to be at the leading edge of the academic field. In July 2023, the University adapted all continuous assessment practices and paper writing exercises to respond to the emergence of generative Artificial Intelligence. Our ability to respond to contemporary challenges in a timely and thoughtful manner, sets us apart from our peers.

For the University to deliver the highest quality of education while expanding, we need to build institutional capacity to operate at scale. The University has focused on developing institutional capacity along two dimensions: **first**, to enable the digital transformation of all academic and administrative processes, and **secondly**, to reimagine and restructure University administration with the support of the governing bodies. This unglamorous work is foundational to the University's current and future success but hidden from public view. So I particularly thank and acknowledge the herculean work of the staff who work tirelessly to give faculty and students a smooth and unruffled educational experience. The University is now prepared to embrace a future where learning is disaggregated by space and time – where in person, online and hybrid learning merge into a seamless experience. I'm confident that our sustained efforts to build institutional capacity will secure our place at the cutting edge of the future of higher education globally.

Recently, our governing bodies adopted several policies and decisions that will shape the University's near term future. I will emphasise two key initiatives: first, the deepening and broadening of academic Research. The University has now adopted a new research policy to democratise leadership of University Centres and Chairs and enhance participation of faculty in collaborative research projects. By investing University resources in supporting individual faculty, Chairs and Centres we're confident that these new beginnings will snowball into a quantum jump in research output at University. Our research output has increased by nearly 50% over the last NIRF ranking cycle. We're hopeful that the new Research Policy will catapult the University into the global league of research leaders.

The second initiative is to foster a greater integration of NLS with global peer Universities and to shape the evolution of law and the social sciences globally. The founders of the National Law School were acutely aware of the international role that the University must play as a global south law school that contributes to a multi-polar world. A world where knowledge is progressively decolonised. We admitted foreign students from neighbouring SAARC countries and Africa to our academic programmes some of whom will graduate today. This year we have adopted three initiatives towards this founding goal: first, to recommence admitting foreign students to academic programmes of the University using a new admission process; secondly, to develop twinning, dual and joint degree programmes with leading Universities around the world, and finally, to develop deep research partnerships with select Universities that facilitate the production of new and useful knowledge in various fields.

These initiatives taken together will allow the University to take its rightful place in global legal education and contribute to the development of a multipolar future. Our engagement with the Jigme Singye Wangchuck Law School in Paro, Bhutan is a guiding example of the nature of relationships we aspire to build beyond our national borders. The JSW Law School is the first and leading law school in Bhutan founded to educate a new generation of lawyers. These lawyers will support the development of the rule of law in Bhutan in a manner that incorporates Bhutanese national culture and values. NLS has engaged with the JSW Law School to support student and faculty exchanges, sharing library resources and facilitating student internships and professional development in India. Her Royal Highness Princess Sonam Dechan Wangchuck, the Founding President of the Jigme Singye Wangchuck Law School, has graciously agreed to be our Chief Guest at the 31st Annual Convocation and we look forward to cementing and deepening our relationship with the JSW Law School in the years ahead.

30TH ANNUAL CONVOCATION

As the COVID pandemic impacted nearly every aspect of daily life and prevented large events/gatherings, the University was forced to conduct its Convocation virtually for two years in a row during 2020 and 2021.

In 2022, after a gap of two years, NLSIU conducted its 30th Annual Convocation offline. The event took place at the Dr. Babu Rajendra Prasad International Convention Centre, Gandhi Krishi Vignana Kendra (GKVK) Campus, Bengaluru. A total of 829 degrees and 48 medals were awarded.

The Chancellor and Chief Justice of India, Hon'ble Justice Uday Umesh Lalit, presided over the ceremony. Shri. Nandan Nilekani, Chairman and Co-founder, Infosys and Chairman, EkStep Foundation was the Chief Guest and delivered the Convocation Address.

INSTITUTIONAL RANKINGS AY 2022-23

The National Law School of India University, Bengaluru was ranked as the top law school in every significant University/College Rankings published during AY 2022-2023. The list includes NIRF (announced by the Ministry of Education), EducationWorld, India Today, Outlook, The Week, Open Magazine, and Careers 360 among others.

These rankings confirms and extends NLSIU's leadership in Indian legal education. Since 2020, the University has committed itself to a radical and comprehensive transformation to redefine the future of legal education in India. This has been carried out through:

- Expanding intake across our academic programmes from 190 (AY 2020-21) to 560 (AY 2023-24)
- Reducing class sizes for core and elective courses by adopting various academic and pedagogic innovations to deliver the best learning outcomes
- Upgrading physical infrastructure to accommodate the expansion on campus new classrooms, a reimagined and redeveloped library, improved hostels and residential amenities
- · A comprehensive digital transformation of all academic, administrative and residential processes
- · Enhancing our research output
- · Recruitment of highly accomplished faculty
- · Rebuilding of our administrative teams to deliver seamlessly on these transformation plans

Further details of each of above-mentioned measures have been elaborated in this Annual Report.

We thank our students, staff and faculty for their efforts to deliver these exceptional outcomes and our Governing Bodies, including the judges of the Supreme Court and High Courts, the Bar Council of India and the Government of Karnataka, for their steadfast commitment and support to the University's efforts to become a leading global law school in the next decade.



LIBRARY REDEVELOPMENT

The Shri Narayan Rao Melgiri Memorial National Law Library, was established with the generous assistance of Smt. Sudha Murty of the Infosys Foundation. The library houses a collection of over 50,000 books and 20,000 journals covering a wide range of general and special subjects, comprising textbooks, reference books, back volumes of journals and reports, apart from current legal periodicals.

Spread over 30,000 sq.ft. built-up area, the Library has been a central node of the NLS campus, and seated at least 250 persons. However, on account of the incremental development on campus, the Library needed to be integrated with the New Academic Block and its surrounding precinct in a usable manner.

In AY 2022–23, we completely redesigned the Library to respond to our community's needs for a space that could be used for teaching and self-study, as well as social use. The Library can now seat 600 persons across its three floors and the terrace. Modernisation of the Library improves accessibility, accommodates increased use of devices, and revamps displays and storage. The Library precinct too is being redeveloped to allow for a seamless connection between the outdoors and the Library space.



Our new Library is reimagined to be the hub of intellectual life on campus, with emphasis on collaboration and collective learning. It accommodates the growing student, research and faculty community and is organized into Zones adapted to various uses.

This massive project was possible because of the support of the Infosys Foundation and the Government of Karnataka. The architects' team at Venkataramanan Associates developed designs, and contractor teams working with the University teams led by our COO, Mr. Shailesh Agarwal with support from Ms. Meenakshi Chauhan, Manager – Projects and Facilities, have delivered this project.

With its proximity to the New Academic Block and the Halls of Residence, the Library will be the hub of University intellectual student life, to be augmented with the development of the Student Activity Centre later this year.

LIBRARY REDEVELOPMENT

Phase I of the Library Redevelopment was completed in May 2023. This included:

ZONING:

- With a mix of soft seating and workstations, the Lower Ground Floor (LGF) is the most informal, social space of the Library. The SBA Common Room and common areas for students are located here, and the Library's light reading/ fiction section shall be housed in the LGF.
- The Ground Floor (GF) houses user seats, the reference section, dedicated research areas, meeting rooms and the dedicated room for Specially Abled Persons. Books on social science topics are located on this floor, along with spaces for displays and exhibits. The balcony is accessible from the GF.
- The First Floor (FF) is intended for quiet reading and working. This floor houses books on legal topics, workstations and an enclosed quiet reading room for users. The Library Terraces are accessible from the FF.

ACCESSIBILITY:

A key goal of the Library redevelopment was to increase ease of use for all, but especially our Specially Abled users. All floors of the Library have been laid with tactile pathways to allow for independent navigation. The Library lift offers access to all floors. Lastly, a designated room on the Ground Floor is equipped with Braille printers, JAWS Talking Reader, desktop magnifiers, smart readers and an Online Daisy Player.

TERRACES:

For the first time, the Library's terrace areas are accessible to users, and have been set up with furniture for working, small meetings and grabbing a quick snack in between. A small tuck shop will serve ready eats on the Terrace. However, no food or beverages are allowed into the library.

ACCESS TO BOOKS/ JOURNALS:

The Library's collection of print volumes has been split between closed stacks (i.e compactors) and open stacks (i.e display bookshelves). Compactors are located in the Lower Ground Floor and the NAB basement, and are accessible for the Library staff.

HALLS OF RESIDENCE

During the previous AY, the University undertook several measures to upgrade campus facilities including construction of new rooms and renovation of some of the existing rooms. The Girls' and Boys' mess blocks, along with dining spaces were expanded.

One of the most significant changes on campus during the Academic Year 2022-23 is the work on expansion of student residential facilities. We have increased the on-campus residential capacity by more than 30% to 1000+ student residences, through the addition of 100 new residential rooms on the newly constructed floors in Narmada and Yamuna Halls of Residence for the women and the Learning Centre block (that will be named Brahmaputra).

Due to this dramatic expansion, all students who required residence space for AY 2023-24 have also been accommodated on campus. This expansion has been possible thanks to the immense effort by the University teams which worked even during term breaks.

Amenities:

All new rooms are constructed to modern standards, including electrical upgrades such as Hi-Speed USB charging ports on the wall. The optimised layout of these rooms allows installation of furniture with increased functional space, and state of the art pocket spring mattresses on the beds.

Rooms in all Halls have been upgraded with new standardised furniture installed in all rooms, and improved lighting. Each Hall continues to have a Pantry equipped with a microwave, hot plate, kettle and a small fridge, as well as seating for common use by all students. Five washing machines are operational across all residential complexes, and two more are getting installed in the Learning Centre.

FOOD AND DINING ON CAMPUS

Over the past Academic Year the University has made several upgrades to our Housekeeping and Catering Services as well as changes in dining options on campus. The University worked with our nutritionist to closely review the Mess menu to introduce more variety, preserve nutrition, and enhance taste in the dining menus. It also introduced Takeaway Breakfasts, and Vending Machines for quick meal/snack options for students, and a common dining area in the Annapurna Mess. Deep cleaning of all the mess spaces, necessary repairs as well as replacement of equipment have been done to ensure a safe and hygienic environment.

UPGRADED CRECHE FACILITY:

To provide a safe, stimulating, and nurturing space for children of our faculty and staff, the University re-opened its in-house creche at a quieter location behind the Training Centre in 2022. The creche has been recently refurbished and equipped with an indoor play and outdoor play area. It is staffed with a Centre Manager/Teacher as well as nannies, depending on the number of children availing the facility.

Recognising the need for skilled and professionalised resources to run the creche, the University has partnered with *Learning Age Pvt Ltd* to operate the NLSIU creche. The Learning Age Preschool & Child Care (2013) operates day care centres, crèches and preschools in Bangalore and currently operates centres in tech parks, residential apartments, corporate houses and universities. It also offers an infant programme, a toddler programme, a pre-school programme, and an after-school programme for children in the age range of 6 months to 8 years. The Learning Program will focus on the child's holistic development across Physical, Social-Emotional, Cognitive and Linguistic domains.



DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

The University is undergoing a thorough digital transformation which permeates several aspects of its functioning. During AY 2022–23, the University implemented a comprehensive digital transformation of all academic, administrative and residential processes to ensure an enabling and friction–free teaching and learning environment.

- LMS: The University has built and deployed an online learning management system that ensures a structured syllabi for every course and the easy availability of reading materials. This learning platform is integrated with video conferencing and the administrative platform to make online learning a seamless experience.
- ERP: The University procured a new (Enterprise Resource Planning) ERP system to reorganise
 the University's People & Culture and Finance functions. Staff and faculty services (e.g. leave
 and reimbursement requests) and student services (fees and scholarships) will be delivered
 efficiently and completely integrated with academic administration to ensure greater integrity
 and trust in systems.
- **Productivity Suite**: In addition to the Google Workspace platform, the University has procured licences to the Microsoft Productivity Suite which includes Microsoft Office, Outlook and Teams. All staff, faculty and students will secure access to the Online and Desktop versions of the Suite. We will roll out training opportunities for all users to become more familiar with this Suite and gradually move many University collaboration practices to this Suite.
- Classroom Attendance: In 2023, the University shifted to classroom attendance being marked through classroom readers and University ID cards. A pilot run was conducted before the process was implemented. This process will help track attendance with ease as the details will be uploaded on the University portals directly.

We are developing a mobile-first approach that will allow users to visualise academic progress and resolve their service issues remotely and quickly. To help carry out these processes, the Academic Administration team has also been upgraded with rigorous training and the inclusion of new members

LIBRARY DIGITISATION:

The University has been working steadily towards digitising its entire holdings, wherein all out-of-copyright books and documents are being scanned and uploaded to the Internet Archive where they will be accessible by the public. We have completed the digitisation of **25,000 volumes** already by June 2023.

The University has enabled access to visually impaired students, and plans to extend the digital lending platform to all students shortly. The Library's extensive digital materials will be available through https://eresources.nls.ac.in




ACADEMIC EXPANSION | AY 2022-23

EXPANSION OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES:

NLSIU admitted **368** students to our on-campus programmes and **2193** students to our off-campus PACE programmes during the Academic Year. As part of the Inclusion & Expansion Plan, the number of students admitted across our programmes were higher (numbers provided in chart below). The University currently has over **900** students enrolled in the on-campus programmes.

The increased intake has allowed the University to accommodate students from diverse backgrounds from across the country and Karnataka. While increasing aggregate student intake, we have reduced class sizes for the core and elective courses by adopting various academic and pedagogic innovations to ensure that we continue to deliver the best learning outcomes in any Indian law school.

ACADEMIC EXPANSION

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

To accommodate our expanded student intake, and further strengthen our teaching and research initiatives, the University completed another round of faculty recruitment in February 2023, for law and social sciences. With 22 new faculty joining us, this was the largest cohort of faculty to join the University in a single hiring round. These faculty members were drawn from well-established schools in the country and overseas, including Stanford and Cambridge University, University of South Carolina, NALSAR Hyderabad, NLU Delhi, XLRI Jamshedpur, KREA University, Jindal Global Law School, and Azim Premji University.

The University recruited 11 core faculty in March 2022, and 22 core faculty in February 2023 for law and social sciences. Additionally, we recruited 10 Assistant Professors for a period of one year during AY 2022–23. We also had 55 external faculty and practitioners delivering elective courses in AY 2022–23. This has not only strengthened our exceptionally talented faculty pool, but has also resulted in providing an unparalleled learning environment for legal education in the country.

Our outstanding faculty continue to contribute to the development of new and useful social and legal research and policy reform at international, national, and local levels.

ACADEMIC EXPANSION

ELECTIVE COURSES

NLSIU offers Elective Courses which allow students to undergo an immersive deep dive into their chosen subject. These courses involve 40 hours of teaching in each trimester and are taught by senior law practitioners, advocates, judges, and prominent members of academia who can provide a more practical knowledge of the law.

In AY 2022-23, the University offered close to 90 elective courses. These courses were delivered by both internal and external faculty. This included as many as 55 external/ visiting faculty that included several eminent personalities. Our elective courses cover the widest range of enquiry in law, public policy and the social sciences - we offer one of the highest number of elective course options of any Indian law university.

These electives cover not only emerging areas of law but also several interdisciplinary electives. About 25–30% of our electives involved topics related to humanities, or at the intersection of law and humanities.

CLINICAL AND EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Clinical electives play a significant role in exposing students to the practice of law and policy. These courses are traditionally taught by practitioners who lend real life experience inside and outside the classroom, including exposure to live cases or clients, thereby bridging the gap between academics and practice.

In AY 2022–23, the University reinvented its experiential learning curriculum to include several new Clinical Courses (e.g. Defending Capital Punishment Cases, Criminal Procedure – Investigations, Data and Criminal Justice). All senior students are expected to take up at least one clinical course during the programme. Additionally, the University offers Externships in collaboration with leading professional organisations including India's top law firms, advocates, and the non–profit sector. Students have the option of signing up for externships in lieu of elective courses.



PROFESSIONAL AND CONTINUING EDUCATION

As the University expands its efforts to provide educational and training programmes of the highest standards to its off-campus community, it is simultaneously deepening its commitment towards improving levels of professionalism and learning in the legal domains. In AY 2021–22, the Distance Education Department was renamed the Department of Professional and Continuing Education (PACE) to better reflect its vision and nature of work.

In AY 2022-23, the department delivered more number of refresher, upskilling, and capacity-enhancing programmes to members of the civil services, judiciary, and professionals engaging with the law in private organisations and in the non-governmental sector.

PACE continues to offer online and hybrid programmes that leverage technology to assist remote learners and provide access to NLSIU's faculty, among the best in the country, to as wide a range of learners as possible.

PACE offers a Masters degree in Business Laws (MBL) and Postgraduate Diplomas in: Human Rights Law (PGDHRL); Medical Law & Ethics (PGDMLE); Environmental Law (PGDEL); Intellectual Property Rights Law (PGDIPRL); Child Rights Law (PGDCRL); Consumer Law & Practice (PGDCLP); and Cyber Law & Cyber Forensics (PGDCLCF)



KEY ACTIVITIES

FOUNDATIONS FOR A LEGAL EDUCATION COURSE

- The third iteration of the Foundation for a Legal Education Certificate Course was completed in the AY 22-23. Overall, 375 students from across 110 cities in India participated in the programmes.
- In this third iteration, new faculty joined hands with the faculty from the foundational year to increase the breadth of perspectives and expertise in the programme.

TRAINING & EXECUTIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

In AY 2022-23, PACE led 20 training and executive education programmes with public and private partners. These programmes were conducted in hybrid and in-person modalities.

- Around 450 members from various professional and educational backgrounds participated in these programmes.
- Executive Education and Training Programmes were specifically designed and curated to meet the requirements of the partner organisations and ensure that their executives have an intensive and enriching experience during the programme and gain useful practical skills for their day-to-day work.
- NLSIU hosted the 9th batch of Forest Range Officer Trainees from the Tamil Nadu Forest Academy
 as a part of their study tour to get an overview on environmental laws. As many as 45 Officer
 Trainees from the states of Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, West Bengal and Tamil
 Nadu visited the NLSIU campus and were also made aware about the online & hybrid education
 programmes run by PACE.

FIRST-TIME INITIATIVES:

- This is the first time that executive education was also delivered in Kannada for the Rani Channamma Training Programmes for the women city constables of Bangalore City Police.
- This is the first time that NLSIU has inked MoUs with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change to offer a PG Diploma in Environmental Law to the Indian Forest Service Officer Trainees' at the Indian Gandhi National Forest Academy (IGNFA), Dehradun for five years
- This is the first time that NLSIU has inked an MoU with the Army Training Command (ARTRAC), Shimla to train 150 officers of Indian Army on cyber law and procurement law at the University campus for 3 years.

RESEARCH INITIATIVES

Over the last Academic Year, the University has taken several steps to nurture and augment research and increase its output in terms of publications, projects, and contribution to policy framework.

KEY UPDATES

PH.D PROGRAMMES & REGULATIONS:

In Ay 2021–22, the PhD programmes were restructured with improvements in the selection process and course work. The University currently offers the PhD (Law) programme, and the PhD (Interdisciplinary) programme. Each doctoral student is guided by a research advisory committee and they can interact with faculty in the research clusters within the University that align with their chosen area of research.

The PhD Regulations have been revised in 2023, setting up a Doctoral Council consisting of a Chair and Vice-Chair who provide leadership to the PhD programmes. The PhD programme consists of course work as well as regular presentations before external experts and faculty members. The course work requirements have been further strengthened this year with each candidate having to qualify a minimum number of selected courses. As a part of the course work, candidates are also provided an opportunity to teach or participate in ongoing research at NLSIU, in areas related to their dissertation, allowing for deeper integration with the NLSIU community and providing diverse feedback opportunities.

RESEARCH CONVERSATIONS SERIES:

The University initiated an ongoing 'NLS Research Conversations' series in AY 2022-2023 to facilitate greater interaction and cross-learning about the diverse areas of research and intervention at the University.

These conversations allow for collective reflection on the broad-ranging research across disciplines and methods, carried out by individual faculty and researchers in Centres and Chairs. Two editions of the NLS Research Conversations have been held so far in 2023.



SECOND COHORT OF THE ACADEMIC FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME:

The University welcomed its first cohort of nine Academic Fellows in AY 2021–22. The two-year full-time fellowship programme aims at recent law and non-law graduates and post-graduates who are preparing to enter law practice or academic careers in law, public policy, or social sciences. In AY 2022–23, we began the process of recruiting nine new Fellows for the second cohort for the year 2023–25.

Fellows will contribute to the ongoing research initiatives at the University and will also have the opportunity to assist faculty with classroom teaching.

P A SANGMA FELLOWSHIPS FOR LEGAL AND POLICY RESEARCH | SECOND COHORT:

In the previous Academic Year, NLSIU signed an MoU with the Government of Meghalaya to jointly offer Fellowships for Legal and Policy Research. The one-year fellowship allows NLSIU graduates to work in the Meghalaya Government and gain experience on the current challenges of law and policy.

In AY 2022-23, upon the request of the Meghalaya Government, the University began the process of selecting the second cohort of Fellows who will work with the Government.

RESEARCH INITIATIVES

KEY UPDATES

NLS SCHOLARSHIP REPOSITORY:

In AY 2022-23, the University launched the NLSIU Scholarship Repository, an open-access platform to showcase research initiatives and knowledge production at the university. The repository is designed to promote access to a diverse range of scholarly output by the NLSIU community. Moreover, it is envisioned as a public knowledge resource for anyone interested in Indian law and public policy. At present, the repository hosts two kinds of outputs:

1. NLSIU Journals:

- Seven of NLSIU's faculty-, student- and centre-led journals were hosted on the repository.
- Each journal has its own customised webpage, with built-in peer review tools. This has helped us automate and streamline all publishing processes—from submission to review and eventual publication.
- The complete archives of each journal were migrated to their new home in the repository.
- Journal teams can now track readership, downloads and citation data.


2. Faculty Publications:

This collection includes a range of writings by NLS faculty members, published by NLSIU as well as external publishers. Over AY 2022-23, scholarly outputs by faculty members—including journal articles, books and book chapters—were uploaded on a common platform, which enables search by author and keywords.

The collection also includes shorter writings and multimedia outputs targeted at general audiences, such as op-eds, blogs, reviews and podcasts.

NLSIU JOINS THE LAW AND DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH NETWORK

In February 2023, the National Law School of India University, Bengaluru became a part of the Law and Development Research Network (LDRN).



The LDRN seeks to enhance knowledge and understanding of the role of law, both domestic and international, in relation to development and governance, as perceived globally and locally. It is therefore concerned with the social functioning of legal systems primarily in the context of countries in the Global South. The community will engage in fruitful discussions from both orthodox and critical perspectives on the role of law in development.

NLSIU INFOSYS DIGITAL FELLOWSHIPS FOR LAW STUDENTS:

Hosting one of India's largest collections of legal books, journals and database subscriptions, the Sri Narayan Rao Melgiri Memorial National Law Library has been an essential part of the experience of studying, teaching and researching at NLSIU.

With the generous support of the Infosys Foundation, the University announced the 'NLSIU Infosys Digital Library Fellowships' to current students of the law in India. The Infosys Digital Library Scholarship project at the University aims at democratizing access to library resources through modes of digital inclusion. The University is in the process of selecting the 100 students who will receive the Fellowships on a need-based assessment. At least 10 scholarships will be reserved for law students with disabilities.

RESEARCH COLLABORATIONS

Continuing our research efforts in 2022–23, NLSIU entered into a slew of collaborations both at the local and international level. We hope to collaborate more in the coming year to produce innovative and relevant research outcomes. Some of our research projects include:

RESEARCH PROJECT ON PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE INDIAN CONSTITUTION SUPPORTED BY THAKUR FOUNDATION

In March 2022, NLSIU commenced a two-year project on Public Health and the Indian Constitution with the objective of analyzing the contemporary public health themes at the helm intersection of law and health. The project supported by Thakur Foundation aims to evaluate the constitutional framework within which the duties, powers and limitations of the government on public health are debated and scrutinized by the courts.

The project entails a survey of leading cases from the Supreme Court of India and the State High Courts on the constitutionality of public health regulations, programmes and policies in India, and the interaction of public health with fundamental rights, directive principles of state policy and the federal structure of the Constitution of India. The scope of examination will include public health themes such as access to medicines, availability and affordability of healthcare services, discrimination in access to healthcare facilities, compulsory vaccinations, digitization and privacy concerns, nutrition support, control of harmful substances and prohibition of their advertisements of harmful substances, regulation of drugs and medical devices, regulation of professions, compulsory bonds, impact of emerging technologies, rare diseases and the extent of state responsibility.

The two-year project will culminate into a compendium of edited cases and materials including critical comments on issues of public health and the Indian constitution.

SWASTH ALLIANCE COLLABORATION ON HEALTH CLAIMS EXCHANGE

NLSIU has collaborated with Swasth Alliance to support development of a digital platform enabling health claims exchange including preparation of a common e-claims exchange standards in accordance with the Government of India's Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission. NLSIU is offering health law expertise to Swasth Alliance on digital health and policy issues by undertaking regulatory research, and policy preparation. Through this collaboration, NLSIU aims to contribute to the evolution of India's digital health ecosystem.

ASIAN HEALTH LAW ASSOCIATION COLLABORATION WITH THE O'NEILL INSTITUTE FOR NATIONAL AND GLOBAL HEALTH LAW, GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY, THE UNITED STATES

NLSIU has embarked on a collaboration with the O'Neill Institute for National and Global Health Law at Georgetown University Law Center, Washington D.C., the United States to support the establishment of the Asian Health Law Association. The other partner universities include Global Health Law Program at the National University of Singapore (NUS) Centre for International Law (CIL), the University of Philippines College of Law, and the National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University School of Law (NYCU Law). The structure of collaboration will be formalized in the upcoming months. It will steer NLSIU on the path of cutting edge research in health law.

RESEARCH COLLABORATIONS

BENGALURU CITY POLICE GENDER SENSITIZATION PROGRAMMES

NLSIU initiated a training project for personnel of the Bangalore City Police department under the aegis of the Safe City Project. The project aims at sensitising the police force and members of the general public on issues of gender and gender based violence, throughout the city of Bangalore. The project consists of two parts- a) training of police personnel and b) training of public bystanders.

To deliver the training programmes, the team at NLSIU Bangalore is collaborating with four non-governmental organisations that have extensive experience in conducting gender sensitisation workshops in Karnataka. The first phase of the project included development of training modules and a 'training of trainers' to ensure uniformity across training delivered by different NGO partners, while the second and final phase involves delivery of the training modules. The sensitisation will broadly focus on the areas of: a) gender stereotypes, b) laws relating to sexual offences, c) laws relating to matrimonial offences and d) communication with victims of crime.

The following activities have been undertaken so far:

- Meetings with NGO partners for development of training schedule, training material, and content of sessions.
- Trainer programmes for personnel who will be delivering the training programme
- Sessions on legal issues were held in two training programmes for "Rani Chennamma Commando Force" of the Bangalore Police

CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH PROJECT

The Criminal Justice Research Project, supported by the Thakur Foundation, is aimed at investigating critical issues in the field of criminal law, specifically focussing on issues of preventive and undertrial detention. The Project has two limbs:

- (1) A study on preventive detention in the state of Karnataka, and
- (2) A study on pre-trial detention, focussing on bail jurisprudence and practice, in particular.

ADVANCED CENTRE ON RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING IN CYBER LAWS & FORENSICS (ACRDTCLF)

ACTIVITIES

- Organised an international conference on "Cyber Security and Cyber Laws" on Feb 04, 2023 in
 collaboration with Dharmashastra National Law University, Jabalpur and Law Mantra Trust,
 New Delhi. Hon'ble Justice A. Muhamed Mustaque, Judge, High Court of Kerala as Chief Guest,
 Mr. Vikramjit Banerjee, Additional Solicitor General of India, Supreme Court of India, New
 Delhi and Dr Subhajit Basu, Associate Professor of Law, University of Leeds were the Keynote
 Speakers during the conference's Inaugural session.
- The Airbus Cyber Innovation and Scouting team, an Airbus department dedicated to research and innovation on the topic of cyber security for all of Airbus consisting of Angela Smith [who is a Cyber Security Researcher with experience in cyber security, networking, software and systems development, primarily designing complex systems for defence / civil powers and large-scale high-profile venues] and Mr. Ashish, visited the centre on 2 nd February 2023 and discussed with the Centre's Coordinator, Dr. Nagarathna about the possible collaborations on research related projects.
- Alumni scholars of the PGD- CLCF 2020-21 Batch visited the centre during their campus reunion program held on 24 th June 2023. They interacted with the centre's Coordinator, Dr. Nagarathna about issues related to "Use of cyber forensics, cyber security and cyber laws."

CENTRE FOR CHILD AND THE LAW

ACTIVITIES

- Helpdesk for enabling access to justice for children CCL has set up a Helpdesk at the Observation Home in Madiwala, Bangalore to provide quality legal and psychological services for children and families in the system. In addition to facilitating legal representation to children, the project works closely with the state and non-state functionaries in the juvenile justice system and engages in capacity building and socio-legal support to children and their families.
- Right to Food National Consultations for State food Commissions CCL organised consultations and orientations for the members of State Food Commissions from various states, including Karnataka, Telangana, Tamilnadu, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Punjab, Meghalaya, and Maharashtra. These consultations provided an opportunity for the members of the Commissions to discuss their role and ways to overcome the challenges confronted during the process of monitoring and grievance redressal.
- Trainings for DGROs in Telangana on State Food Security Rules CCL team conducted training for the designated District Grievance Redressal Officers (DGROs) under National Food Security Act 2013. The training was conducted in collaboration wit Telangana State Food Commission. DGROs from all districts of Telangana were oriented on the Central Ruled under NFSA that are relevant to their role, in addition to Telangana State Rules and conceptual and normative framework relevant for grievance redressal.
- Centre Coordinator Dr. Neetu Sharma was nominated for the International Visitor Leadership Programme (IVLP) by the United States Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, on Child Rights and Protections. As part of this programme, she had the opportunity to visit and understand the child protection system in six states of United States.

CENTRE FOR CHILD AND THE LAW (CCL)

OUTPUTS

- Guidance on age appropriate tasks for children and youth involved in cotton farming CCL undertook a research study on the potential risks and harms for children working in the cotton production sector in India. The study was commissioned by Better Cotton Initiative (BCI). The study largely reflected on the legal framework and juxtaposed the real life situations of children engaged in different kinds of work in cotton farming. The study resulted in a set of recommendations for the cotton producers for safeguarding children against any imminent or potential harms and risks.
- Adequacy of Anganwadi Centres in tribal and urban areas in the state of Karnataka Based on
 the assessment of adequacy of anganwadis in tribal and urban areas of Karnataka, a report was
 submitted to the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka by
 CCL. The <u>study</u> looked at the adequacy of anganwadis from quantitative as well as qualitative
 aspects, identified major gaps and suggested solutions for ensuring equity and quality of
 services.
- Blog post Hunger and Malnutrition in India after a decade of National Food Security Act, 2013 On the completion of 10 years of enactment of National Food Security Act (NFSA) 2013, Dr. Neetu sharma, Ms Jyotsna Sripada and Ms Shruthi Raman, reflected on the shortcomings in the process of implementation of NFSA and explored the provisions of the law that may be utilised for eradicating hunger and malnutrition from the country.
- Revisiting the Significance of Social Investigation Reports: Bearing Witness to the Silent Testimonies from the Field Building on the insights from the 'access to justice' initiative of CCL, Arshita Satsangee and Ms. Annmary Jacob authored a paper for the Fourth Issue of the Children First Journal on Children's Rights published by the Delhi Commission of Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR). The paper drew from the social workers' experience of preparing Social Investigation Reports (SIRs) and captured the voices of Children in Conflict with the Law (CICLs) and their families. The purpose of this article was threefold first, to throw light on the disposition of children in the juvenile justice system; second, to document good practices for conducting SIRs (and similar tools) and third, to rethink the effectiveness of the tool in its current form.
- Parliamentary Discourse on Nutrition: What motivates parliamentarians to ask questions CCL conducted a <u>study</u> on the nature and extent of discussion on the issue of nutrition in the Parliament through collating and analysing the questions raised in both the houses of parliament on this issue over a period of 20 years, between 2001 to 2021. This study resulted in identification of probably triggers and sources behind these questions and established the need for enhanced engagement of parliamentarians on the issue of nutrition. The study was supported and published by UNICEF and is available on its website too.

CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAW EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND ADVOCACY (CEERA)

ACTIVITIES

During AY 2022-23, CEERA undertook the following projects:

- A two-year dissemination project by the Department of Justice, GoI, on "Pan India Legal Literacy and Legal Awareness Programme" under the Designing Innovative Solutions for Holistic Access to Justice (DISHA) Scheme.
- Research and policy project on "Evaluating the Legal & Policy Framework on Promotion, Standardization and Protection of Indian Business: Towards Effective Implementation of the Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Mission" and organized an International Conference on Self-Reliance in Trade and Development: Re-Defining The Contours of Law and Policy
- Collaborative project titled "Wetland Conservation, Sustainability of Commons and Climate Change in the State of West Bengal" in association with the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata

OUTPUTS

- In April 2023, the efforts of CEERA were acknowledged by the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka in submitting the Manual on "Prosecution of Offences: Water Act 1974 and Air Act 1981" as a direction in Crl. P 8067/2019. The CEERA team completed the work within two months of the the orders of Justice Suraj Govindaraj. The High Court order dated April 17, 2023 stated: "The Karnataka High Court places its appreciation to the National Law School of India University as also the Centre for Environmental Law Education Research and Advocacy for preparing such exhaustive reports."

CENTRE FOR INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RESEARCH AND ADVOCACY (CIPRA)

The activities of CIPRA are conducted in collaboration with the DPIIT Chair on Intellectual Property Rights at NLSIU under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Government of India.

ACTIVITIES

- Organised "World IP Day" at International Training centre, NLSIU Bangalore on 28th April 2023
- Chair Professor Dr. T. Ramakrishna and team had a meeting with delegates from Meghalaya Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) who visited the DPIIT Chair on IPR at NLSIU on 16th May 2023. The primary purpose of the meeting was to discuss GI Tagging initiatives in Meghalaya and seek expertise on the same. The delegation included: Shri James PK Sangma, Chairman and former Cabinet Minister, MIDC Shri Delanee D. Nongmalieh, Managing Director, MIDC Shri Kerlang Malngiang, Advisor, MIDC, Shri Anirban Paul, Advisor, MIDC.
- The Chair organised a Round table Conference on "Evolving trends for an International Regime on Intellectual property, Genetic Resources and Associated TK" on 29th March 2023. The objectives of this conference was: interrelationship of genetic resources and associated traditional knowledge with IP, mandatory disclosure requirement of source / origin of the genetic resource as well as associated traditional knowledge, the consequences or sanction associated with non-disclosure and the 'information systems' of GRs and associated TKs. These issues were addressed in three distinct but related sessions.
- Mr. Jnana Teja Bandi, Research Associate, CIPRA, delivered a talk on "Idea, Innovation and IPR" at Impact Lecture Series 2 (A sponsored program of Ministry of education's Innovation cell (MIC)) organized by Pragati Engineering College, Andhra Pradesh on 20th July 2022

CENTRE FOR LABOUR STUDIES (CLS)

ACTIVITIES

- Research on Jordanian Garment Industry in collaboration with ILO: The Centre for Labour Studies (CLS) was invited by ILO Jordon to carry out a research study of Industrial Relations in the Garment Sector in Jordon. Production was carried out through women workers from Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Pakistan, Myanmar, Syria and India. The study involved extensive interaction with all stake holders. A report containing recommendations for decent conditions at work highlighting the misuse of overtime work in conjunction with hostel accommodation was submitted to ILO. The report has been accepted and is under publication. (May 1 to August 31, 2021)
- Research on working conditions among Gig and Platform workers in the Food delivery sector: Two studies (one before Covid and the other after Covid) were completed with active involvement of the workers in this employment and their trade unions. The usual propaganda that Gig workers are entitled to handsome incentives was found to be non-existent. We found that even after 10 to 12 hours of work, food delivery workers hardly earned a minimum wage. The use of algorithms and cell phones coupled with designating them as "partners" proved to be control devises to deny workers basic labour rights. Our research has contributed to the State Government reluctantly exploring better systems to alleviate exploitation of Gig & Platform work and has approached CLS from time to time to explore better legal interventions. (June 1 to December 21, 2021)
- Rulemaking under the four Labour Codes for the Government of Chhattisgarh: The CLS won this assignment through competitive bidding. This mammoth work running into more than 500 pages was carried out with the help of six scholars and the labour department through online weekly meetings. Among opposition ruled states this state was the first Government to complete the Rule making process (not yet completed in many States) and notify the draft rules through its gazette for public consumption. (March 31 to September 30, 2021)
- Work on the four labour Codes: The first phase of work on the four labour codes was completed in June 2022. Each Code was examined in detail and a critique of its main features was undertaken. The repeal of 16 sectoral laws and 13 general laws was studied. A comparative study of the newly incorporated sectoral laws with its repealed version clearly reveals major deficits and further erosion of labour rights-especially in the informal sectors. During the ongoing second phase, we will undertake proposals for concrete amendments to each Code and revisit all the repealed sectoral laws. (May 1 to June 30, 2022)

CENTRE FOR THE STUDY OF SOCIAL EXCLUSION AND INCLUSIVE POLICY (CSSEIP)

ACTIVITIES

- Organised a summer school for 13 students of William & Mary College, USA from May 26 to June 03, 2023. The summer school included a lecture on Indian society and exposure visits to different civic organisations and their interventions in Bangalore.
- Talasamudayagala Adhyana Kendra of CSSEIP organised a five-day Research Methodology
 Programme for 50 Ph.D. scholars, selected from 15 universities belonging to Scheduled Castes, during
 06-10 March 2023. This programme was sponsored by Dr. Babu Jagjivan Ram Research Institute
 Social Welfare Department, Government of Karnataka.
- Talasamudayagala Adhyana Kendra of CSSEIP was engaged in research and advocacy work for the
 formation of rules under Karnataka Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their
 Rehabilitation Act, 2013. Through series of meetings with different stakeholders, a comprehensive
 report was drafted and submitted to Government of Karnataka. Safaikarmachari Development
 Corporation directed a committee involving faculty members of TSAK to frame rules for adoption.
 TSAK was also involved in advocacy for ending the contractual labour of safaikarmacharis in the town
 Panchayat, Municipality, Mahanagara Sabhas, and their regular recruitment in these local bodies.
- A research and collaborative work with Institute of Social Studies, Hague that began in 2017 with funds from ICSSR culminated in an edited volume of The State of Accountability in the Global South (publisher Edward Elgar, 2023).

CENTRE FOR WOMEN AND THE LAW (CWL)

- The Centre for Women and Law began a collaborative venture with the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka and NIMHANS to set up a Centre for Excellence on Violence Against Women in Karnataka. The three year Project headed by Professor Sarasu Esther Thomas will focus on making family laws and other laws work better for women. The work has now begun with Sumitra Acharya joining as a Lawyer to assist the team.
- The Centre continued its work in responding to policy initiatives and providing technical help in training programmes for the governmental and non governmental sector.

INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC POLICY (IPP)

ACTIVITIES

- Organised a two-day workshop on 'Future of Work, Future of Social Security' at India International
 Centre, Delhi in collaboration with Oslo Metropolitan University, University of Helsinki and Nordic
 Centre in India during 1-2 March 2023. Apart from paper presentations, the event brought together
 partners from industry and government to respond to challenges posed by the technological changes
 in the world of work.
- Organised a three-day conference on "Inclusive Development: Role of Employment and Environment" in collaboration with Institute of New Economic Thinking (INET) and Young Scholars Initiative (YSI) during 28-30 March 2023. The keynote address was delivered by Jens Lerche of School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London at Bangalore International Centre.
- The Institute of Public Policy collaborated with Social Accountability forum for Action and Research (SAFAR) to hold national level dialogues on developing a citizen charter for transparency on the use of common resources. During 2022–23, seven national dialogues were held funded by Foundation for Ecological Security (FES). These national dialogues were held in collaboration with people's movements in different locations. The thematics of these dialogues were: forest commons (Mumbai), digital commons (Bangalore), coastal and oceans commons (Pune), urban commons (Shillong), culture commons (Tiloniya), and non-forest common lands (Jaipur).
- Organised conversations on "Exploring New Imaginaries of Environmental Justice" in collarboation with Environment Support Group, Bangalore, on 28 April 2023 at Infosys Science Foundation. These conversations had two panels: (i) on "Reflexive Democracy: Ecological Transformations, Agroecological Promises and Public Health Imperatives", and (ii) on "Governance challenges in making a new world".
- "Just Society: Rule of Law and Equal Access to Welfare" is a collaborative educational programme with South Denmark University (Denmark), University of Brasilia (Brazil), University of Johannesburg (South Africa) and Ilia State University (Georgia). This 13-week online educational programme was designed to comparatively study welfare states in these countries.

CHAIR ON CONSUMER LAW AND PRACTICE (CLAP)

ACTIVITIES

- Initiated a research project on August 1, 2022 aimed at Building Capacity for State and UTs for Implementation of Direct Selling rules funded Indian Direct Selling Association. The object of this project is to develop a legal framework for establishment of Monitoring Authority under the Consumer Protection Act 2021. The chair developed the Consumer protection (Monitoring Authority) Rules which will be submitted to Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Government of India.
- Successfully organised a "Three Day Capacity Building Programme for Members of Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission of Kerala" sponsored by GoI, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution Department of Consumer Affairs, New Delhi, from February 1-3, 2023 at NLSIU, Bangalore.
- Successfully organised an international virtual conference on "New Facets of Consumer Protection: Challenges and Way Forward" on 19th November, 2022 in association with Ministry of Consumer Affairs, GOI. The conference proceedings is published through an edited book titled Consumer law and Practice: Contemporary Issues and Way Forward (ISBN-978-93-9111-02-1)

The Chair, which has been fighting against tobacco products since a decade, initiated a research project funded by Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids, US. The project aims at strengthening the Tobacco Control Legislation and its effective implementation. As part of this, the following activities were undertaken:

- Successfully organised a National Consultation on "The Enforcement of Prohibition of Electronic-Cigarettes Act 2019-Challenges and Way Forward", on 23rd February 2023 at Indian Law Institute (ILI), New Delhi. The consultation was conducted in collaboration with the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), GoI. Ms. V. Hekali Zhimomi, Additional Secretary, MoHFW, GoI and other Ministry officials were present at the event.
- Organised two webinars on "Steps to strengthen India's Tobacco Control Law-Trial/Tribulations/Progress and Way Forward" in association with Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids (CTFK) (i) on October 13 & 14, 2022, and (ii) on 25th August 2022.

OUTPUTS

- Published the International Journal on Consumer Law and Practice (IJCLP) Vol. 10, 2022 (ISSN-2347-2731), in November 2022. The IJCLP is indexed in SCOPUS/UGC-CARE/HeinOnline/Google Scholar/SCC OnLine nov 2022
- Published the Bi- Annual Newsletter "March on Consumer Law and Practice" in July 2022 and January 2023.

CHAIR ON RELIGIOUS MINORITIES

ACTIVITIES

The Chair is mandated to undertake projects funded by the Department of Minorities Welfare, GoK. In AY 2022-23, the Department released a sum of Rs.20 lakh with the request that we may take up a research project on the subject of "Evaluation of Educational Programmes undertaken by the Department of Minorities Welfare, Government of Karnataka".

- Based on this grant, a pre-project seminar was organised for seeking inputs from experts on the Concept Note submitted to them. The Chief Guest was NLSIU Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sudhir Krishnaswamy, who also gave his inputs on how the research project should be formulated and implemented. Based on the seminar inputs, we collected data from the Department of Minorities Welfare, and drafted a preliminary report which is likely to be submitted by the end of this month.
- The Chair will also be carrying out a field survey, contacting the beneficiaries of the educational programmes to seek their views on the implementation process of this programme. The final report will be prepared incorporating the field experience on the implementation process.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE CHAIR

ACTIVITIES

- During the period June, 2022 to June, 2023, the DoR Chair had carried out studies on the following topics and submitted reports and recommendations on them:
- i. Study on the Input Credit Scheme in GST
- ii. Study on Taxation of Cross-border Services in GST
- iii. Study on revamping the Special Valuation Branches in Customs
- A two day workshop on 'Prosecution in Tax Matters' was held at Bangalore in association with the Centre of Excellence (CoE) on 24th and 25th of November, 2022
- During this period, the DoR Chair delivered 14 lectures on various aspects of taxation at the

BENCHMARKING AND STRENGTHENING THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN KARNATAKA POLICE

ACTIVITIES

- Successfully completed a study on the status of policewomen in Karnataka.
- Carried out in partnership with the Karnataka State Police (pursuant to MOU dated 27 May 2022), the study involved visit to 35 police stations across 7 districts, interview with around 50 officers and a survey administered to 240 personnel, all at different levels within the state police. It puts forward several recommendations for improving the working environment for policewomen and will be submitted to the state police by end of July for review.
- Developed a compendium of institutional policies, programs and initiatives from around the world on strengthening the role of women in policing. This will be published by end of 2023.
- Organized a webinar on 20 December 2022 on global trends on women in policing, with Ms
 Jane Townsley, International Association of Women Police and senior police officer (retired),
 United Kingdom, as the keynote speaker.

OUTPUTS

- Published an Explainer Note in English and Kannada on the legal mandate for policewomen in India. This was widely distributed during the field visits.
- Published two blog pieces on NLS's website sharing reflections on gender dynamics at police stations from the field. Notably, the piece titled "Police Stations: Lonely Workplaces for Women in Karnataka" has been published in the International Association of Women Police ejournal available on Social Science Research Network. The paper can be accessed here.

Preventive Detention in Karnataka

- Survey of literature on preventive detention has been completed, and a draft paper has been prepared.
 - Data collection on preventive detention in Karnataka is currently underway. Data collection includes collection of statistics on the number of prisoners preventively detained in the state in the years 2020-2023, supplemented by interviews with lawyers and police officials.

Pre-Trial Detention (Bail)

• Preliminary survey of literature, in order to prepare a paper analysing existing bail jurisprudence and practice is currently underway.

LAW AND TRANSFORMATION: OPENING CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN INDIA AND GERMANY"

ACTIVITIES

In 2022, NLSIU embarked on a collaboration with the Chair for Comparative and Public Law, Humboldt University, Berlin under the Indo-German Partnership in Higher Education (IGP) programme of the University Grants Commission, in collaboration with DAAD. The activities undertaken during AY 2022-23 include:

- Student Exchange (Humboldt University to NLSIU): NLSIU hosted seven undergraduate students and three PhD scholars from Humboldt University in AY 2022-23.
- Student Exchange (NLSIU to HU): NLS funded four PhD scholars to spend two months each at
 Humboldt University. The scholars are associated with the Chair on Comparative Law headed
 by Prof. Philipp Dann, and are required to undertake their research, as well as any other
 academic obligations as directed by the Chair. These scholars were selected after a competitive
 process, and their projects will benefit from the time spent researching and writing at HU.
- Faculty Exchange: NLS funded three faculty exchanges with Humboldt University for 2022–23. Each faculty member spends up to two months at HU, working closely with the Chair on Comparative Law headed by Prof. Philipp Dann, undertaking their research, participating in the weekly research colloquia at the Chair, presenting their work at the Chair, holding a workshop/teaching a short course for students at HU, and overall participating in the intellectual life at the Chair. Two faculty members have already participated in the exchange, and another one is scheduled to participate later this year.
- Young Scholars Workshop: NLS hosted a Young Scholars Workshop in March 2023. This workshop brought together Indian and German doctoral scholars to discuss their projects and receive feedback on their papers.



SBA OFFICE BEARERS FOR 2022-23: GIRIJA BHOSALE & MANTHAN DAYANANDA

The student-led committees at NLSIU conducted various activities during the Academic Year. Below are some of the key activities of each of the committees.

ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR) BOARD

- A Negotiation Workshop for University Selection Rounds 2022-23 was conducted in October 2022 to familiarize the first-year students and others new to the field of dispute resolution with the concept and strategies of negotiation.
- University Selection Rounds of Negotiation [19th November 21st November 2022] The students underwent a rigorous elimination process in the form of a written qualifier, preliminary rounds, and then the finals. A total of 170 teams (consisting 2 members each) had registered to participate in the Rounds, out of which the top 80 teams proceeded to the Oral Rounds. Based on the final rank list, the teams were offered competitions from our Offerings pool.
- A guest lecture by Sr. Adv. Pramod Nair Talk on Alternative Dispute Resolution [18th March 2023] was held online, covering a wide array of topics such as Arbitration versus Litigation and the future prospects in mediation.
- Organised the IX Edition of the National Law School Negotiation, Mediation and Client Counselling Competition from 28th 30th April 2023. This is one of the largest ADR competitions in Asia, conducted in-person for the first time since 2019, owing to the COVID-19 pandemic. A total of 165 participants representing over 25 prestigious law universities took part in the event, showcasing their skills and expertise in negotiation, mediation, and client counselling.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAM

- Project Writing Orientation (13 July 2022): A team of senior students across batches provided an in-depth introduction to academic research and writing, using the ASP Project Writing Primer as the anchor point.
- Word Orientation (14 July 2022) was conducted in a workshop format to equip students with the required skills to effectively use MS Word, the pre-dominant word processing software used in Law School for writing projects, and other assignments.
- Database and Citations Orientation (16 July 2022) was conducted to equip students with accessing the E-Resources provided by the library, and introducing the OSCOLA citation style guide used for most papers in Law School.
- ASP Research and Writing Database: A repository of recordings of the aforementioned orientations, along with workshop notes and guides to good academic writing continues to be maintained on the ASP Student Database.



CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (CDMC)

FIFA World Cup 2022 Final Screening: The screening provided an opportunity for students from diverse backgrounds to come together and celebrate their shared love for football. It transcended social and cultural barriers, fostering a sense of inclusivity and camaraderie among the attendees. The event facilitated interactions among students who may not have otherwise connected. It created a common ground for students from different disciplines, fostering new friendships and networking opportunities.

The Night After Christmas - A Treasure and Scavenger Hunt: A Treasure Hunt was organised on the 31st of December 2022, to celebrate the time before New Years, encourage teamwork and puzzle solving and give students a reason to closely explore the common areas on campus.

Click It: The Campus Photography Event: In line with the vision of expanding its mandate and social media presence, CDMC organized the 2nd edition of its annual online photography competition, "Click It", in the third trimester of the last academic year.

CULTURAL AND FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

- Beginning with the celebrations in December and to get into the true holiday spirit, the Committee organised the Christmas Carnival on 24th December 2022, consisting of Christmas Nominations, wherein students were invited to write and send small notes of gratitude/affection to members of the student body and the staff, which were then collected and distributed by the members of the Committee. On the eve of the main celebration, various games, followed by an evening filled with music and food was organised for the incoming batches, with a goal to facilitate communication between the incoming and the existing batches.
- Conducted the Makar Sankranti and Pongal celebrations on 15th January 2023 which included kite flying and rangoli making, to commemorate the end of winter and the onset of spring. It also celebrated Holi by organising Nazm Night'23 on 11th March 2023. Students from across the batches were invited to participate in this evening of poetry.
- The flagship event of the Committee, 'Univ Week' was hosted in the first week of May 2023. The event forms the biggest intra-college platform for the students across the batches to showcase their talents in a variety of forms such as music, dance, drama and art. - FIFA World Cup, Labor Rights: A panel discussion led by Professor Saurabh Bhattacharjee, Professor Babu Mathew, Professor Ashna Singh, and Jasoon Chelat
- Three Lecture series on Reading Reservation: "Savitri Ambedkar Phule Caravan ('SPAC') and LawSoc conducted a three-part lecture series on 'Reading Reservation'



LAW AND TECHNOLOGY SOCIETY (L-TECH)

- Thinking Computationally: This series was divided into four modules, Introduction to Programming, Working with 'Computer' Things, Text Manipulation, Fundamentals of the Web which aims to take students through programming and algorithms, digital evidence, legal research and text-manipulation, scraping through multiple judgements.
- Research Panel of the Data Protection Bill: The Law and Technology Society (LTech), NLSIU collaborated with the Internet Freedom Foundation (IFF) to assist the IFF in preparing a report on the Digital Personal Data Protection Bill, 2022 (DPDPB 2022).
- Panel Discussion on Digital Surveillance of Safai Karamcharis in Karnataka: In January 2023, L-Tech hosted a panel discussion on the exploitation of Safai Karamcharis in Karnataka. The panelists included activists, lawyers, journalists and academics who have been working on issues of the intersection of digital surveillance with that of manual scavenging and sanitation workers' rights.
- Consilience 2023: Online Gaming and IT Rules 2021: In March 2023, L-Tech organized its flagship conference, Consilience 2023, on the theme of online gaming and the amendments to the IT Rules 2021 in collaboration with the All India Game Developers' Forum ('AIGDF').

LEGAL SERVICES CLINIC (LSC)

- Awareness: To spread legal awareness, LSC conducted legal literacy programmes, distributed newsletters and pamphlets within different areas in Bangalore. This year, LSC attempted to spread awareness by creating interactive informative posts on social media platforms. LSC has also engaged with various organizations towards creating easily accessible digital resources for legal information on welfare schemes, labour laws, and disability rights.
- Legal Aid: LSC provided legal aid to about 17 clients this academic year. The subject matter of the client's queries included but was not limited to: land laws, property law, medical negligence, divorce, and child custody. Legal aid was provided by way of connecting the client with a lawyer from our pro bono panel of 16 alumni who are practicing in Bangalore and Delhi, researching the client's issues, and providing other paralegal services to assist the lawyer representing the client, all on a pro bono basis.
- Projects: LSC was engaged in various projects in collaboration with organizations and research centres. The projects involve working on child rights and providing assistance at the juvenile observation homes, creating legal awareness, working on labour law related cases among others.



LITERARY AND DEBATING SOCIETY (LND)

- The University Debate Rounds serve as NLS' internal selection rounds for participation at inter-collegiate debate tournaments over the year. 90+ students of the university, across batches and programmes, participated in the University Rounds.
- Quizzes: Business Quiz , Music, Entertainment, Literature & Arts (MELA) Quiz, International Law & International Relations Quiz, India Quiz
- Debates: The 20th edition of the National Law School Debate took place from the 21st 23rd of April, 2023 on the NLS Campus. Traditionally held in the Asian Parliamentary 3 v 3 format, the National Law School Debate has been one of the biggest and most prestigious debating tournaments in South Asia. The second offline edition since the outbreak of the pandemic, witnessed the participation of 34 teams from across the country.
- The 11th National Law School Debate Junior: The 11th edition of the National Law School Debate Junior was organized on 14-15 January. Around 60 students from Grades 8-12 of schools across Bangalore participated in the event.

MOOT COURT SOCIETY (MCS)

- MCS conducted a Moot Workshop on 5th December 2022. This workshop was the first
 event conducted for the First year BA LLB students by the MCS. The purpose of the session
 was to give students a brief idea about mooting, the process of reading the problem,
 dividing the work and researching on the issues, writing memorials and making oral
 submissions, and also to alleviate any fears related to mooting. The workshop was taken
 by Aarohi Chaudhari, a student of the IV Year BA LLB Batch, one of our eloquent and
 successful mooters at NLS.
- The Demo Moot Workshop was held in December 2022 by the Moot Court Society for the first year B.A., LL.B (Hons.) students. The primary goal of the session was to offer students an introduction to Moots and to understand the semantics, body language, rules of procedure, case preparation and oral arguments presented in this activity.
- MCS conducted the annual Novice Rounds for first time mooters on 25th March 2023.
 There were two benches, each consisting of two judges, to judge the oral rounds. The
 purpose of the rounds is to introduce first years to mooting and everything that comes
 with it, such as engaging in in-depth research, honing advocacy skills, making oral
 submissions and engaging with tough questions posed by benches.
- MCS conducted an Oral Advocacy Workshop on 8th April 2023. This workshop was
 specifically organized for already constituted moot teams who would represent NLS in
 upcoming National and International Competitions. The workshop was taken by
 Aniruddha Basu, Principal Associate in Khaitan & Co. He is one of the most experienced
 and successful mooters of NLS and has been actively involved with the NLS mooting
 community over the past years by acting as a mentor for constituted teams and judging
 moot competitions organized by MCS.

STUDENT COLLECTIVES

DISABILITY SUPPORT GROUP (DSG)

- Tiffin services for PWD students: Duration: July 2022 to March 2023: The collective recognised the issues PwD students in LC faced in availing MHoR mess services. In furtherance, DSG started a programme with volunteer students across courses and batches to set up a group for providing a tiffin service to the challenged.
- A sensitisation session on disability was conducted for the first-year batch at NLS on 11th August 2022. The session led by Prof. (Dr.) Sanjay Jain, was an attempt to identify what disability means and how it plays out in the life of a law student, the different kinds of disabilities, the importance of using language and conduct which is sensitive and respectful, and how to be an ally. It was organised to make the campus an inclusive and disability-friendly space.
- Collaboration with ASP: Duration: April 2023: DSG collaborated with ASP to ensure the accessibility of the ASP drive. Additionally, ASP made all ASP notes accessible with screen readers. DSG took the initiative and identified handwritten notes, which were not accessible to students with visual impairment.

NLS FEMINIST ALLIANCE (AOW)

- Feminist reading circle: a reading circle centered around feminist theory and we started off our event with a chapter from 'Feminist theory- from center to margin', by bell hooks, chapter name- 'Sisterhood'.
- Judgments Rewriting Project Session on Disability Rights: Perspective by Mr Rahul Bajaj In this session, Mr Bajaj covered basic concepts related to disability rights studies such as ableism, reasonable accommodation, indirect discrimination and intersectionality. Moreover, he focused on studying legal material by exhibiting attentiveness to social realities that a disabled person confronts and recognising how an impugned law or practice operates to the detriment of the disabled individuals.



STUDENT COLLECTIVES

NLS QUEER ALLIANCE

- Sensitization Sessions for UG and PG batches These sessions dealt with the difference and relation between sex, gender, and sexuality; identities and labels within the queer community; and basic norms of respect and safety to follow when interacting with queer people to make the campus a safe space for queer people.
- Privilege Walk The NLSQA, along with the NLS Feminist Alliance, Savitri Phule Ambedkar Caravan (SPAC), Diversable Alliance (DA) and the Disability Support Group (DSG) conducted the privilege walk for incoming UG and PG batches.
- The Judgements Rewriting Project The NLSQA, in collaboration with the NLS Feminist Alliance, organized a workshop of the Judgements Rewriting Project
- Namma Pride The NLSQA arranged for interested students to attend the Namma Pride March 2022 held on 27th November.
- Book Discussion: Queersapien by Sharif Rangnekar The NLSQA, in collaboration with the Law and Society Committee (LawSoc) organized an online book discussion on Mr. Sharif D. Rangnekar's book titled 'QueerSapien'. The book explores the author's perspective as an openly queer person in a conservative society.

SAVITRI PHULE AMBEDKAR CARAVAN (SPAC)

- A caste-sensitization session was conducted for incoming batches. The session was
 designed in such a way that it did not require any prior knowledge of anti-caste
 theory. Most of the discussion was built up on the observations which are easy to come
 by in the Indian society.
- Movie Screening: SPAC hosted the screening of the film, 'We Have Not Come Here to Die'. The film chronicles the events leading up to Rohith Vemula's suicide on 17th January, 2016. The movie screening was of immense importance as it sought to draw attention to the development in the anti-caste movement following the death of Rohit Vemula. The screening was followed by a question-and-answer session with the director of the film, Deepa Dhanraj.
- A panel discussion on Workplace Surveillance of Safai Karamcharis was hosted by SPAC and the Law and Technology Society, NLSIU. The discussion had panelists from across the spectrum of law and policy dealing with the extremely contemporary issue.
- Velivada: As part of the Dalit Fest 2023 to celebrate Dalit History Month, SPAC announced Velivada, an Art Installation. The art installations were placed in the NAB foyer and featured the artworks from some of the well-renowned DBA artists.



STUDENT GROUPS

THE NLS ANIME BRIGADE

The NLS Anime Brigade ('Anime Brigade') was fully constituted in November 2022. Since then, we have conducted various events and other activities to maintain and promote the anime culture on the NLS campus. The Anime Brigade's focus has remained conducting small-scale and non-competitive events and activities that can serve as a way of relaxation and rejuvenation for the attendees. So far, we have focused on periodically organising the screenings of anime movies that have spanned diverse genres; and conducting regular outreach with the student body through our Instagram handle and via email.

In the near future, we plan to expand the scope of our events to those that also involve other types of cultural activities, such as Anime-Themed Pub Pools and Quizzes. To this end, we hope to collaborate fruitfully with the other committees and student clubs that have past institutional experience with organizing such activities.

KA'LAW'KRITI

- Logo making competition: In this online event, the art club invited the artists in NLSIU student community to create logos for the art club that would be used by it in its future mails.
- Pre-Pride Pub pool: This event was conducted in collaboration with the Queer Alliance before the Namma Pride parade. Over 100 participants came and made their posters for the pride parade.
- Constitution Day Pub pool: The Constitution Day pub pool was organized under the guidance of faculty member Dr. Ashna Singh. Participants made posters relating to the Indian Constitution, fundamental rights, and good governance.
- Disability Day Pub Pool: This pub pool was held on the occasion of the international disability day. Participants created drawings to spread awareness regarding the need for reasonable accommodation, the need for equitably treating persons with disabilities, and echoed their rights.
- Origami Tutorial-cum-Pub pool: In this event, the participants learned and cherished the art of paper folding. The participants created diverse origami works including the Chinese gondola, the origami man, birds, butterflies, and tulips.

STUDENT GROUPS

NLS NATURE CLUB

The Nature Club organised a flagship trek to Ramdevarabetta. Ramdevarabetta is acclaimed for numerous things- it's a must-visit destination for camping and rappelling, along with the fact that the classic film Sholay (1975) was filmed there. The club identified endangered Vultures at the foothills.

Organised a plant distribution activity to introduce a bit of nature's touch in our hostel lives. Having and nurturing a plant provides peace and happiness and is aesthetically pleasing. Last Christmas, we provided potted plants to people who have been wanting to grow plants.

In furtherance of its Climate Advocacy Arm, the Club began Recycling Drives in September 2022, where participants collected scrap paper on campus and sent it for recycling. CONCLUSION

As Amartya Sen reminds us, we are argumentative Indians who often disagree about the ends we must pursue or the appropriate means to secure these ends.

Despite these reasonable disagreements, that we make progress at all, is due to the resolute and unbending support of the Supreme Court of India led by our Chancellor, Hon'ble Chief Justice of India Dr. D Y Chandrachud. The Hon'ble Chief Justice of India, and his sister and brother judges, have built a protective and nurturing moat around the University that allows it to pursue these goals with conviction and determination.

The Government of Karnataka had the foresight and wisdom to invite the Bar Council of India to establish the first National Law School of India at Bangalore. It is with the Government's generosity and goodwill that we have been able to make a State supported public university the No.1 Law School in India today. And it was the visionaries in the Bar Council of India in 1988, in collaboration with an inspiring founding team led by Prof. Madhava Menon, who imagined that such an institution of excellence can be built here at Bangalore.

It is to this unlikely, but auspicious coalition, that we at National Law School of India owe our gratitude and thanks. We are here today because this magical combination of patrons has helped us meet and sometimes exceed our founders' dreams. We will need your wisdom, grace and your willingness to dream with us a collective future that far surpasses our present successes.
