### Contextual Integrity: Privacy as Data Governance

"Contextual Integrity (CI) is a different way of defining privacy – not as secrecy and not as control over personal information but as appropriate flow". **Prof. Helen Nissenbaum, Cornell Tech** delivered an insightful lecture at the NLS campus in January 2025. Her talk reviewed key theoretical ideas behind contextual integrity, provided evidence of its empirical robustness, and explained why successful regulation of privacy needs to be accompanied by effective data governance, which is aimed at protecting legitimate societal institutions ('contexts') and their associated ends and values. The talk was jointly organised by NLSIU and the Infosys Science Foundation.

## Centre for Child and the Law at NLSIU Launches Child Rights Index

The India Child Rights Index (ICRI), launched by CCL in November 2024, is a tool to understand the comparative status of children in all States and union territories of India in three domains: Nutrition and Health; Education and Protection. The Index is developed based on 60 indicators across these three domains. The index categorises groups of States based on their performance across these indicators, and also ranks them domain wise.

### Exploring Themes Around 'Equality and the Law'

Equality is a foundational concept of legal systems. Equality before the law and the equal application of law are centrepieces of the legal system. There is wide ranging discussion about what equality means within the general legal framework and in the practice of law. These questions are not only questions of legal system, but concern problems that have deep roots in the long reflection about what justice in ethics and politics actually means.

These themes were explored during our 'Equality and the Law Workshop' in collaboration with the Faculty of Law, University of Zurich (UZH) in December 2024. The workshop aimed to foster interdisciplinary engagement around problems of equality in the law, and catalyse collaboration between early-career scholars of the two universities.
